We were all saddened to hear of the passing of Myron Nelson on October 8th at the age of 94. Myron served as president of the Senior Center for 14 years (the longest of any CRSC president).

Myron initiated a number of new things at the Center while he was president. He started the "Write Your Life Story" class led by Cherie Reed, and it still continues to this day led by Evelyn Wooster. He started our Bingo games which continue to be a staple every Saturday. And Myron was most proud of starting the "Bridging the Generations" program between the Senior Center and the Castle Rock High School. Students come every Wednesday (and formerly Fridays) to serve lunch, as well as eat and visit with the Seniors. This unique program is the only one of its kind held in Washington.

Myron also spearheaded several improvements to the building while he was president. He helped to build the breezeway on the south side; requested new windows be installed, had the dining and main rooms painted and arranged for new flooring to be installed in the main room.

Myron is survived by his wife Mary (an active member of the Senior Center), his daughter Pam and son Dave, four grandchildren and one great grandson. In lieu of flowers, the family requests that contributions be made to the Castle Rock Senior Center in Myron's name. Myron will be greatly missed by all who knew and loved him.
