NOMINATING COMMITTEE

According to the Senior Center's Bylaws, wherever an officer's position must be filled, a nominating committee consisting of one Board Member and two Members at Large, must be formed at least 60 days prior to the election. The terms for the positions of President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer all terminate at the end of this year.

Therefore, it was decided at our Board Meeting on April 29, 2024 to get an early start on this process, since all four positions need to be filled. Diane Johnson agreed to be the Board Member, and we need two Members at Large to assist. Please let her know if you're willing to help. This is a very important process, and it's your chance to get involved.

MEMBERSHIP DUES

At our Annual Membership meeting in February 2023, the Bylaws were changed to require \$12 per year to be paid for membership. At the Board Meeting in December 2022, the Board decided any member previous to that time should be grandfathered in, and continue their lifetime membership of \$5. However, it has been brought to the Board's attention that some members feel that all members should pay yearly dues, and the grandfather clause be discontinued.

At the Board Meeting on April 29, 2024, it was decided that in order to put this issue at rest, the Bylaws need to be updated accordingly. At our next annual membership meeting, a vote will be taken and must be passed by two-thirds in attendance. It will be decided at that time to include the grandfather clause in the Bylaws, or to discontinue that clause completely, and all members be required to pay yearly dues.

It was further decided at our April 29th Board Meeting that all membership dues will be due and payable on the first of January, with a grace period of 15 days. Any new member joining will be prorated on a monthly basis. This will streamline the bookkeeping side of collecting dues..

IN MEMORIAM

We were so saddened by the passing of **Evelyn Wooster** on April 3rd. She was 86. Since 2003 Evelyn had been a member of the Write your Life Story class, and then became the teacher about 10 years ago. Carol Hubbard said she was "the glue that held us together". Evelyn grew up in Pittsburgh PA and met husband Donald in San Diego. They had two children, and adopted Castle Rock as their home in 1961. While in Pittsburgh, she was one of the first women to join the all male volunteer fire dept. While in Castle Rock she served as a municipal judge, was the star reporter of the Cowlitz County Advocate, was an active member of the Methodist church, was active in the Friends of the Library, and was an avid garage sale goer. She will be truly missed by all who knew and loved her.
